grub - food (informal).

Let's get some grub. I'm starving.

unappetizing - unappetizing food does not look or smell attractive and does not make you want to eat it.

Most exotic foods are too **unappetizing** for me.

off - (of food and drink) no longer fresh or good to eat or drink because of being too old.

This food is so exotic. Is it suppose to taste like this or is something **off**?

guzzle - to drink quickly, eagerly, and usually in large amounts.

Hal gimme that beer. I'm gonna **guzzle** it down. Something is **off** about this exotic fish soup.

gulp down - to eat or drink something quickly.

I'm so hungry I wanna gulp this down, but it is so exotic I'm not sure how to eat it.
